## Child Find 2019-20 by State

This table represents each State's Child Find numbers for deaf/hard-of-hearing children reported during 2019-20 (pre-Covid).

Column one shows reported public school enrollment for the state. Column two is $3 \%$ of enrollment which is a conservative number of children with hearing loss based on what we know about newborn hearing screenings (3 per 1000 births) and what the CDC reports about school-aged children (14.9\%). The last column is the reported children in each state who are listed with hearing loss.
